COVID-19 (CORNAVIRUS) Update 3/25/2020

The President and Commissioners of the Town of Princess Anne have passed a Declaration of Emergency effective 3/20/2020 @ 9:00 AM.

- Town offices will remain staffed during normal business hours with extremely restricted access to all Town buildings for the general public. Trash collection will continue **please bag and tie your trash** and place it in a can with a lid.
- Princess Anne Police Department will continue to provide law enforcement services.
- All Bars, Restaurants, Gyms, and Theaters are closed to the public as of 5:00 PM March 16, 2020. Food drive thru, carry out, and delivery services are able to continue operations.
- Grocery stores, banks, pharmacies, food delivery, gas stations, and other essential services will be **OPEN**.
- Non-Essential businesses are **CLOSED**.
- The pavilion and pirate ship in Manokin River Park are closed, the rest of the Park is open for passive recreation. The playgrounds at GHYC and Beckford Avenue Park are closed. The basketball and tennis court at GHYC are closed. The GHYC walking trail is open.
- Gatherings which exceed 10 people are prohibited.
- Please be advised that the COVID-19 Emergency is a rapidly changing situation and actions are subject to change.

Please help stop the spread of COVID-19. We urge all residents to follow CDC requirements for their personal protection and the protections of others:

- Wash your hands often and sanitize surfaces
- Maintain social distancing - remaining at least 6 feet from others
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
- Cough or sneeze into your elbow or a tissue
- Stay home if you feel unwell and call your health care provider for guidance
